Anne Marie Rafferty is **President of the Royal College of Nursing, Professor of Health Policy, former Dean** of the Florence Nightingale Faculty of Nursing and Midwifery, King's College London

She is a historian, health workforce and policy expert, graduated from Edinburgh University in Nursing Studies, MPhil (Surgery) Nottingham University, first nurse to gain a doctorate (DPhil Modern History) from Oxford University.

She was seconded to the Department of Health to work with Lord Ara Darzi on the Next Stage Review of the NHS and awarded a CBE for services to healthcare in 2008. She served on the Prime Minister's Commission on the Future of Nursing and Midwifery 2009-10 and been recipient of various awards; Nursing Times Leadership Award in 2014 and Health Services Journal Top 100 Clinical Leaders Award in 2016 and nominated one of the 70 most influential nurses in the 70 year history of the NHS.

She holds fellowships from the **Royal College of Nursing**, **American Academy of Nursing** and one of the first nurses to be elected to the **Academy of Medical Sciences**.

She co-led a Student Commission on the Future of the NHS, supported by NHS England, to inform the Long Term plan of the NHS and was a member of the panel for the Parliamentary Review of Health and Social Care in Wales 2018-19. She is a member of the policy group overseeing the development of the People Plan for the NHS & NHS Assembly in England
